
*Here are a few fun exercises that might be useful to try in between work activities during the day! Set a timer for 30seconds and see how many you can do! Enjoy!



Maths: Counting

- Youtube counting songs: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=6RflKqkvHTY
- Remember to try to practice writing your numbers 0-5 each day. This can be done with crayons, pencil, paint, chalk, playdough and practice tracing with your finger (on the table, on someone's back, in sand, etc.). See if you can make rainbow numbers by using lots of colours by repeatedly tracing over the number using a different colour each time. (Rhymes for the correct number formation is in week 20th-24th April).
- Also counting and number games or easy activities you can make at home are very
 effective and useful to play too. Here are a few ideas in the pictures below;









- This week we are continuing to learning about combining numbers and also matching.
 - 1. Try writing out some combining sums on pieces of paper, sticky notes, card, the back of a cereal box. Write the numbers 1-5 a few times on pegs. Get your child to pick a sum for example 2 + 3. Allow them to read it out and they can use fingers or objects to try and figure out the answer (perhaps the circles template we used last week would be useful here, I will leave a picture at the end). When they figure out the answer to the sum, they find a peg with that number on it they clip it onto it. Repeat lots of times.
 - 2. Roll two dice (or if you only have one roll it twice) and make up sums using the dice.
 - 3. You can use the sums you have on small pieces of paper and write the numbers 1-5 nice and big on post-its or paper. Your child has to figure out the answer and as quick as they can swat the answer by hitting the correct number on the table (they could use a spatula or wooden spoon if you don't have a swatter). Repeat and see how fast they can find the answer.
 - 4. You can write the numbers big on a page or card and put them in order on the floor. They can physically jump the sums. For example, 1 + 4. Ask them what number to start at? (number 1). How many more are we adding on? (4). Get them to jump forwards 4 jumps and see what number do they land on. They land on 5, so the answer is 1 + 4 = 5.

- 5. You can use lots of things you have at home to practice combining withing 5 such as, deck of cards, dominoes, write sums on Jenga blocks and play or playing hopscotch,
- 6. Try to encourage your child to think of ways to come up combinations to make a number. For example, say to them 4, what ways can we make the number four? 2+2/1+3/4+0/0+4/3+1
- 7. It is also important to enable children to understand that 2 + 1 is the same as 1 + 2. Try this by writing all the combinations to 5 that there are on paper or post-its. Then turn them upside down. They choose two pieces, if they think they are the same they keep them, so if they pick a 0+3 and a 3+0 then that is the same just in a different order.






- Also, board games or games where you roll a dice are great for counting and number recognition









Reading

• Phonics - Ditty Books: 1 ditty story each day

These will help with the revision of individual sounds, blending and reading sentences. • Sight words: revise these words

- Practice reading these 5 words (remember we do not sound these out, we just say them!) Here are a few activities;
 - Game 1: Write the words on paper and turn them over. Pick a card, get it right you get to keep it. Whoever has the most at the end of the game wins.
 - Game 2: Write the words on paper cups or stickers and stick them to cups. Get another person to hide a coin, or dice or block under one of the cups. You have to say the word before you pick up the cup to see if the word is underneath.
 - Game 3: You could make up some Bingo cards using the sight words and play Bingo!
 - See if you can find these words in books or games.
- Continue practice making, blending and reading words using letters.
 - Continue to practice making CVC words using the letters you cut up from last week.
 Practice this lots of times with different words / see how many you can do in
 30seconds / make simple sentences.

Writing

 This week our handwriting letters are; k, f, j. If an adult writes each letter nice and big, you can trace them with your finger practicing the formation and then you can write it using your pencil, crayons, chalk or sprinkle a small bit of salt or sugar on a plate you can make the letter with your finger. (Below is a link to the handwriting book online and the letters for this week are pages 50 - 55)






